Measles it isn't just a little rash



Measles can be dangerous, especially for babies and young children.



MEASLES SYMPTOMS TYPICALLY INCLUDE

- High fever (may spike to more than 104° F)
- Cough
- Runny nose
- Red, watery eyes
- Rash breaks out 3-5 days after symptoms begin



Measles, a highly contagious virus, has been confirmed in Northern Health. Measles is characterized by fever, cough, runny nose, and inflamed or red eyes. These symptoms are followed by a rash that typically begins on the face and neck, then spreads to the chest and extremities, and lasts about 4-7 days. Those that may have been exposed or are developing these symptoms should seek medical attention. Please call first before going to your primary care provider's office, urgent care or emergency department so appropriate precautions can be taken.

Measles is also very serious, with almost 1 in 10 people being hospitalized. It can cause serious complications like pneumonia, encephalitis (inflammation of the brain), and even death.

Vaccination is available and recommended for everyone born in 1970 or later. Vaccination is important in protecting our vulnerable populations such as the elderly, pregnant people, immunocompromised individuals, and children less than one year old. Getting immunized with at least two doses of measlescontaining vaccine is the best way to prevent measles. Please contact your local public health office (Stewart Health Centre) if you are unsure of your vaccination status or you need your measles vaccination.

Currently, there is only one active case of Measles in Northern Health in North-East British Columbia. However, Stewart experiences a high traffic of travellers and tourists during the summer months, introducing possible illnesses to the community.
